
Policy on Expiration Dates of Pharmaceuticals in Research Animals

It is the responsibility of the Colorado State University (CSU) Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) to ensure judicious and humane use of animals used in its teaching and research programs that is consistent with federal requirements* and CSU's highest ethical standards.

The *Guide for the Care and Use of Laboratory Animals* and the USDA Animal Welfare Act prohibit the use of expired substances on research animals.

All pharmaceuticals used for research animals must be clearly labeled with the expiration date as outlined below to easily identify the expiration dates.

 Upon receipt the containers are labeled with a color-coded sticker to indicate the year the agent expires.¹



- The numerical designation of the month of expiration is written on the sticker. For example, 1 is used to denote January, 2- February, 3- March, etc.
- Place the sticker in a clearly visible location on the container. In this example, the compound expires June 2028.
