Programs of Research & Scholarly Excellence (PRSE)

Programs are awarded this designation because they have achieved great distinction and set a standard for excellence in research, teaching and service that may serve as a model for programs throughout the institution and externally.

The PRSE designation will provide enhanced visibility and enable advocacy in the context of the larger re-search and training missions of CSU.

History of PRSE at CSU

Initiated in 1991 – built on the CCHE programs of excellence

Two fundamental assumptions:

- Designation sets a very high standard for earned qualification
 - Only a limited number of programs selected
 - Originally 12 programs were designated as PRSEs
 - Currently 19 programs have this designation
- Designation is not given in perpetuity
 - Established programs must requalify
 - Designation is for 4 year period

Application Format



❑ What does the application look like?

- ❑ Limited to maximum of five (5) pages of narrative including tabular material
- ❑ Appendices limited to five additional (5) pages of supporting information.
- ❑ To the extent possible, application material should be presented in tabular form to facilitate ease and expediency of evaluation and comparison between nominations.

❑ What to submit?


- ❑ An single electronic (PDF) file is to be submitted to the OVPR by close of business on the date designated as the nomination deadline.

❑ What qualifies as a “program”?

- ❑ Concentration, Center, Institute, SAU, Department, etc.
- ❑ Academic units will need to demonstrate the integrated "programmatic" value of their scholarly activities.

Application Materials – 1. Cover Sheet

The cover sheet for applications should include the following information:

- Name of PRSE and statement of current PRSE status (i.e. currently a PRSE or not)
 - Name of director/lead of PRSE and other key personnel (e.g. associate director)
 - List of contributing departments/colleges/units
 - Information on external advisory board (if applicable)
 - Names and contact information of three potential external reviewers
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Application Materials – 2. Narrative

Narrative [maximum of 5 pages (excluding references), single spaced, 11 point Times New Roman font with 1" margins"].

Application narratives must

- ❑ **Make a compelling argument for the designation of PRSE**
 - ❑ Supported by appropriate, qualitative and quantitative data
 - ❑ Demonstrate the scholarly and educational impact of the program.
- ❑ **Include information about**
 - ❑ Membership [faculty, research associates, collaborators and trainees (students, postdocs)]
 - ❑ Organizational structure and demonstrated synergy of program (i.e. evidence of elevation because of PRSE-quality efforts)
 - ❑ 4-year strategic vision as a PRSE and how the PRSE designation will advance the program
 - ❑ Evidence of achieved excellence


Narrative – Additional info

- ❑ In addition to “nuts and bolts”, additional “compelling” info is important
 - ❑ Anything that sets you apart and speaks to the “research and scholarly excellence” of the program
 - ❑ Peer comparisons
 - ❑ Describe the impact of the program on its fields, CSU’s missions and broader society
 - ❑ Demonstrate internal and external collaboration and partnerships, relationship-building, and/or capacity strengthening
 - ❑ Names and contact information of individuals capable of providing objective external evaluation of the PRSE (coversheet of the proposal)
 - ❑ OVPR may contact these or others for additional information/review of application


Application Materials – 3. Appendix

Appendix with supporting material [maximum of 5 pages (excluding references), single spaced, 11 point Times New Roman font with 1" margins"]. Content should be focused on additional evidence supporting potential designation as PRSE.


What's different?

- ❑ There is no “filtering” process at the college level
 - ❑ Previous calls had colleges endorsing a select number of PRSEs
 - ❑ Streamlined application process
 - ❑ Previous process usually resulted in 100's of pages and tons of work
 - ❑ Still need to demonstrate history of excellence, just not the minutia
 - ❑ All designated PRSE programs include graduate student support provided by the graduate school
 - ❑ OVPR funding will be a separate process from the PRSE designation
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So, what about the funding?

- ❑ RFP for additional funding is still under development – seeking feedback
 - ❑ Provides opportunity for more funding – greater impact, enhanced activities, increased visibility
 - ❑ PRSE linkages with other strategic investments, including One Health, cluster hires, SAUs, and/or other new opportunities articulated in the CSU strategic plan – encouraged, but not required
 - ❑ Evaluation of impact
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Funding Availability

- ❑ Proposals may request a maximum funding of \$100K over two fiscal years
 - ❑ PRSEs may apply in each year of the 4 year PRSE designation (FY17-FY20)
 - ❑ Cost sharing is encouraged, but not required
 - ❑ Requests are for one-time funds
 - ❑ No-cost time extensions must be requested no later than April 15 of the 2nd FY and are not guaranteed
 - ❑ Major changes in project direction require OVPR prior approval
 - ❑ Awards made in any FY do not imply funding approvals for the same or similar requests made in a future FY
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Proposed Activities for Funding

- ❑ Allocation of these funds should lead to substantive impact in research or scholarly excellence
 - ❑ Visibility, high impact, creativity
 - ❑ Examples: conferences, workshops, colloquia, special events, development activities, research capacity building (especially if tied to potential substantial extramural funding), and graduate student success initiatives (e.g. corporate or translational internships).
 - ❑ Other ideas?
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Review Criteria for Funding

- Enhance graduate student success
 - Build relationships with key partners to increase diversity
 - Fresh perspectives, creativity
 - Align with current university or OVPR strategic initiatives such as cluster hires, SAUs, interdisciplinary institutes or schools
 - Include collaborators from other institutions or private sector partners, especially with an innovation and discovery element
 - Measurable impact and outcomes
 - OTHER?
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Reporting Requirements

- ❑ To remain eligible for OVPR funding, PRSEs must submit a report on their activities, by close of business on June 15, 2017
- ❑ The report should include:
 - ❑ A summary of the project activities including an evaluation of the impact that the funding had on the strategic goals of the PRSE and the University;
 - ❑ Outcomes assessment that references the projected outcomes, metrics, and timeline included in the original request;
 - ❑ Detailed report of expenditures

Timeline for PRSE Funding

- ❑ RFP will be issued soon after PRSE designations are made
- ❑ Due Date (*early in fall 2016 semester - projected*)
- ❑ Funding available after July 1, 2016

- ❑ Reports will be due June 15, 2017
 - ❑ Annually on June 15 for multi-year funding
