Dear Research Community,

This week, due to increased cases in Larimer County and our red level, we launched a weekly screening requirement for all researchers who meet two criteria:

1. Are on an approved research return to work (RTW) plan whose work site is in Larimer County
2. Have interactions with others in their workspace

The implementation of a regular cadence of screening is essential for maintaining the health and well-being of our community. I want to thank everyone for their participation, particularly given the short notice. Regular screening will provide you with important information as to whether or not you should isolate to prevent the transmission of the virus.

Many of you have questions. We understand your concerns and encourage you to continue to reach out to us through our pandemic support email (VPR_ResearchContinuity@colostate.edu) or to email your Research Associate Deans, Institute Directors or Melissa Reynolds (melissa.reynolds@colostate.edu). Early next week, we will post some of your most commonly asked questions to our COVID-19 [Research website](#).

Saliva screening, which is for people WITHOUT symptoms only, will be available from 9 a.m. – 5 p.m. Monday through Friday in the MAC Gym at the CSU Student Rec Center. Enter through the East Entrance – see this [map](#).

- If you have not had a previous saliva screening at CSU, you must [register](#) for one. This is only required once.
- Once you register, you must [schedule](#) a window for your screening.

People WITH symptoms should fill out the [COVID Reporter](#) and CSU Public Health will arrange for a nasal swab test.

Thank you for all you are doing to keep our CSU community healthy and safe.
