On behalf of the Executive Committee for the NIH Ruth Kirstein Institutional National Research Service Award Training Grant (T32 NRSA) "Infectious Disease Research and Response Training Program", it is my pleasure to offer to you an appointment on this training grant. The Executive Committee ranked candidates based upon candidate qualifications, mentor laboratory, relevance of the project to infectious disease, and progress during enrollment in the current PhD program. Final selection was made based on input of the committee and consideration of applicants that most closely filled the criteria for the award as outlined in our grant application. Your selection reflects the strength of your credentials and application in these areas.

All training program fellows are appointed annually for two years, given appropriate progress, and are intended to provide stipend-supported training in biomedical research for PhD candidates under the mentorship of a faculty mentor participating in the program. This position would commence [Date] and will provide stipend and support as listed below.

Your mentor has agreed to cover the additional stipend amount to reach the standard stipend of \$30,000. The T32 Executive Committee will stay in touch with you as with all T32 appointees. In this respect, we plan regular meetings with trainees and with mentors to share experience, progress, improve the program, and discuss individual development plans.

If you wish to accept this appointment, please send an acknowledgment of your acceptance within 10 days. ## **Terms & Conditions**

### **NIH Commons Administration**

Trainees are required to maintain personal profiles in NIH commons and keep them up to date following graduation with employment details and subsequent grants received. Additionally, trainees are required to complete both appointment/reappointment or termination forms promptly within the xtrain system in commons.

### **NIH Reporting Requirements**

We are required to submit annual progress reports to NIH on May 1st each year. In April, all funded trainees will be asked for a brief progress report, detailing research progress, presentations and any planned publications. Trainees will also be required to summarize these accomplishments for a termination report to NIH upon completion of the fellowship. Finally, as an NIH requirement, we will contact you annually over the next 15 years to collect information on your career and persistence in research, publications and grants.

### **Citing the Grant**

You must cite this training grant on all publications and any other tangible outcomes based on your doctoral research, *including those that are published after your fellowship*. The award number is **T32GM136628** and the recommended language to include in your publications and presentations is: "Supported by NIH Grant Number T32GM136628. Contents are the author's sole responsibility and do not necessarily represent official NIH views." All publications must have the grant affiliation assigned in your NCBI My Bibliography and must receive an NIH PMID number to be compliant with NIH public access policy (<https://publicaccess.nih.gov/policy.htm>)

### **Regulatory Requirements**

You are required to comply with the training requirements for Responsible Conduct of Research training (both online and face-to-face). Acceptable face-to-face courses are listed at <http://rcr.colostate.edu> and must be completed in the first year of the fellowship.
